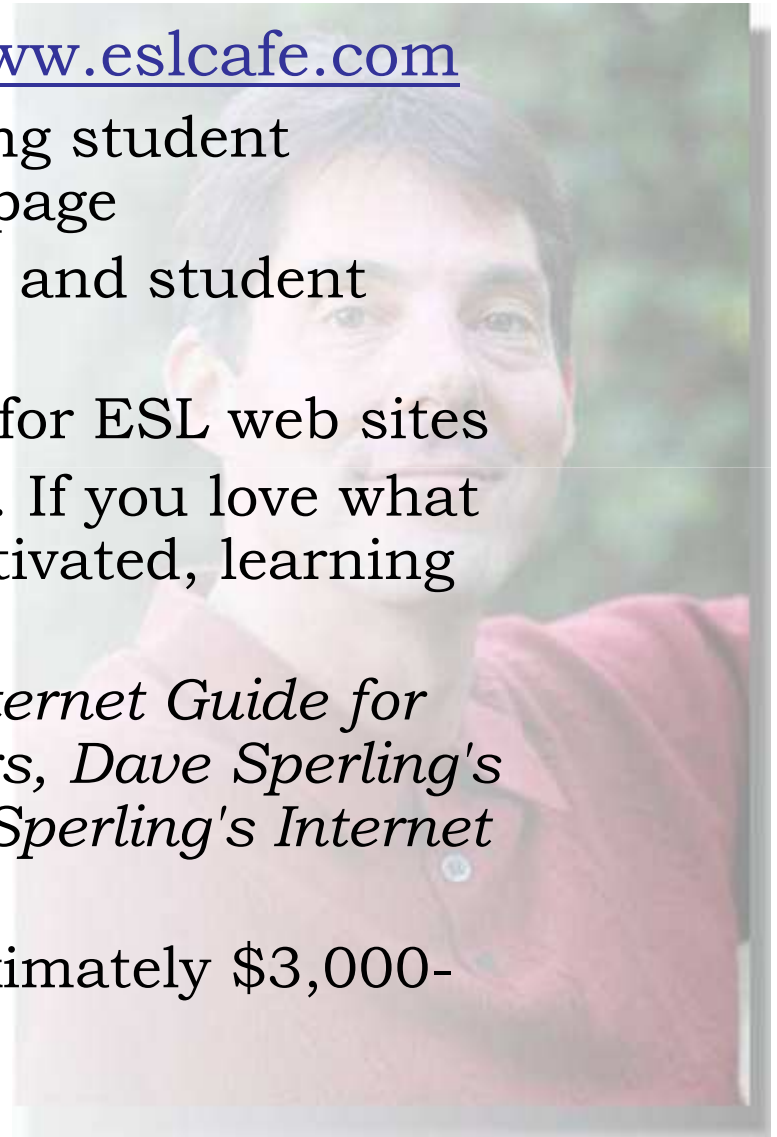
- taught ESL/EFL in Dubai, now currently in Shanghai, China

8) **Dave's ESL Café** www.eslcafe.com

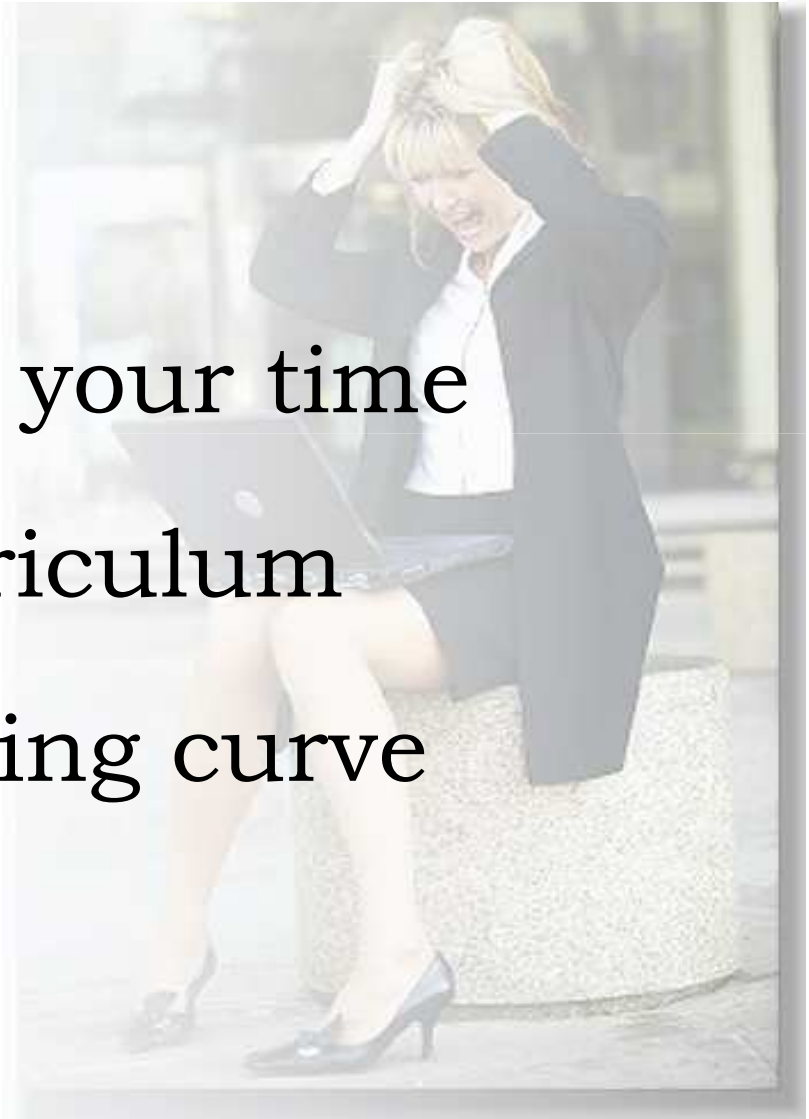
- started with just presenting student compositions and graffiti page
